Once, Saint Sergius was praying, and he had a vision of the Holy Theotokos, along with Saints Peter and John. Can you find them in the icon?




A LEADER OF MONKS SAINT SERGIUS OF RADONEZH

Saint Sergius of Radonezh (in Russia) was born 700 years ago, but we still remember him in our Church. We remember him because he did so much to help people grow closer to Christ!



Saint Sergius wanted to spend time in quiet prayer, so he started to live out in the wilderness, far away from other people. But people found out about him, and they knew he was a holy man. They wanted to learn from him, and they wanted to find out how they could grow closer to our Lord, too. After a while, Saint Sergius sent some of his followers out to different parts of Russia. They started more than 400 monasteries, places where people could pray and learn more about God.

That first monastery that Saint Sergius started was once out in the woods, away from everybody. But now it is huge place with many churches and monks, and lots of visitors too!

We celebrate St. Sergius on Friday, July 5th (July 18th, OC).
