SAINT HANNAH THE PROPHETESS



Have you ever prayed to God for

Tomorrow, we celebrate a saint from the Old Testament (before Christ). Saint Hannah prayed very, very hard to God because she really wanted to have a baby. Once, she went

to the temple to pray. She cried to God because it meant so much to her. Hannah asked God to let her have a child. God listened to her (He always listens) and He gave her a beautiful boy, Samuel. When he grew up, Samuel was a great prophet who helped God. Hannah had five more children too after that!

Hannah is a great example to us because she knew that when she had a problem, she could turn to God first. She wasn't angry at God because she didn't have a child. She loved God, and she asked Him to help her.
