


Christ's Joy

You can see some wildlife there too! Is it a bear in the background?




SAINT COLUMBA

Today we celebrate Saint Columba. In our Church, we call him the "enlightener of Scotland," because this wonderful saint told the people of Scotland something they never knew before. And what was it? It was the



good news of Jesus Christ. Saint Columba brought Scotland the light of Christ!

Saint Columba was born in Ireland in the 500's, but he left for Scotland because the people were pagan. Many people there worshipped things in nature, like trees. Saint Columba started a great monastery on the little Scottish island of Iona. He baptized the pagan king there, and he also baptized the king of the Scots there too.

Saint Columba understood the pagan people's love for nature. Saint Columba loved nature too. One story tells us that when the saint built the monastery in Iona, he wouldn't let even one tree be cut down! But Saint Columba knew that nature was God's gift to man. He knew that God had created the world, so he worshipped God and not the trees!
