



SAINT MODESTOS OF JERUSALEM

PROTECTOR OF ANIMALS

Do you like ani- mals? Do you have a pet that you play with? Or have you been to a farm with cows and chickens and goats and sheep? When we have an animal, we always try to take care of them, because they are God's creatures too!



Tomorrow we celebrate a saint who loved animals, and he knew they are part of God's beautiful creation. Saint Modestos led the Christian church of Jerusalem as patriarch about 1,400 years ago. Saint Modestos led his people with faith and love. What we remember him most for though is his love for animals! Saint Modestos wrote a prayer for the blessing of animals that our Orthodox Church still uses today. The prayer says, "Yes Lord, look down from your holy dwelling place and bless these animals, as you blessed the flock of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, and of all your faithful servants."

On his feastday, some Orthodox Christians remember Saint Modestos. They even sprinkle holy water on their animals and pray to this holy saint. Sometimes priests throughout the world visit farms of Orthodox Christians and bless the animals there. You can remember Saint Modestos tomorrow too. You can ask him to pray to God for you, your family, and your animals. Remember, you are all part of God's creation!

We celebrate St. Modestos on Mon., December 16th (Dec. 29th OC)
