You remember a little bit about

Moses, don't you? You remember the story of the Exodus out of Egypt, and the burning bush, and the Ten Commandments. God chose Moses to do many special things for His people.

Moses had an older brother, Aaron, and God chose Aaron to serve Him too. The Bible tells us that Moses was "slow of speech" when he spoke to his Hebrew people. Maybe he was nervous, or maybe he just talked in a funny

way. God told Aaron to speak for his brother; God would tell something to Moses, and Moses would tell it to Aaron, and Aaron would speak to the people.

Later on, Aaron also spoke to Pharaoh (the king) for Moses too. Do you remember when they asked him to let the Hebrew people go, to be free?

After that, Aaron became a high priest. That meant he could make sacrifices to God, asking God for help. The Hebrew people would come to Aaron, because they knew he had this special place with God.

We can read many other stories about Aaron in the Bible. He is one important person who brought us all closer to God. Did you know he is a great, great (many greats...) grandfather to Saint John the Baptist?
