Maybe you go to a big church in a big city or a tiny church in a little town or something in between. Maybe you even go to church in a little village on a mountainside.



No matter where your church is—if it's big or if it's little— we worship in spirit and truth every time we gather in the Orthodox Church to pray! Jesus foretold it!




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SAINT EUPHROSYNE A PRINCESS OF POLOTSK

Does the icon here look like a picture of a princess to you? No, not really, but Saint Euphrosyne *was* a princess, who lived a thousand years ago in Polotsk (which is now in the country of Belarus).

Her name was Princess Predslava, and she had everything going for her! She was rich and smart, and her parents wanted her to get married to a nobleman. Predslava felt that she wanted to spend her life in another way



though. She left her comfortable life to become a nun, taking the new name Euphrosyne.

Euphrosyne lived in the basement of the beautiful Saint Sophia Cathedral. They didn't have computers and printers in those days, of course. Euphrosyne spent long hours every day copying books, word by word. She made some money, and she always gave it to the poor. Later on, she left this work because the bishop asked her to start a new women's monastery. She taught young girls to read and write, and taught them to earn their living in other ways too.

Saint Euphrosyne lived a long life, helping others and trying to do what the Lord wanted her to do. She died in Jerusalem, and eventually her relics were moved back to the monastery she started. She is a special saint many people still love today!

We celebrate Saint Euphrosyne on Monday, May 23rd (OC: June 5th).
