### WHAT'S IN AN ICON?

Lots of times, we might not know what a saint really looked like...especially if he or she lived a long time ago.

But in an icon, we can still find out about that saint. What can you say about St. Militsa from these icons of her?



## SAINT MILITSA PRINCESS OF SERBIA

Have you ever seen somebody who knows how to stay calm under pressure? Police officers and firemen and all kinds of other workers have to keep calm, even when they have a lot to worry about!

Saint Militsa knew how to keep calm under pressure. She was a princess in Serbia about 600 years ago. Her husband was killed in a war, and her son was next to be the ruler of Serbia. (He wasn't old enough though, so Saint Militsa ruled for him until he was old enough.) Saint Militsa had all kinds of pressure—she wanted Serbia to stay at peace even when other countries tried to invade hers. But even with all those troubles, she stayed strong and calm. Saint Militsa trusted God to give her courage and wisdom.



Saint Militsa built a beautiful convent for nuns in Serbia. She wrote poems and hymns and prayers, including a special "Mother's Prayer." Later on, she became a nun and lived there at that same convent. The Ljubostinja convent is still there, and about 50 nuns live there now. They have a special love for Saint Militsa because her holy relics (her body) is at the convent. Also, they pray to her for help and for the country of Serbia, which she ruled so well…even under pressure!
