# **2nd Sunday of Matthew**

### THE CALLING OF THE FIRST DISCIPLES

Jesus called Peter, Andrew, James, and John to leave behind their boats, nets, and jobs to follow Him. They didn't ask, "Is this what everyone else is doing?" or "What will people think?" They just trusted Jesus and followed.



Following Jesus isn't always easy. Sometimes it means making choices that are different from what our friends do. Maybe it's choosing to pray, tell the truth, or be kind when others are being mean. The first disciples showed us what real courage looks like: following Jesus even when it's not popular.

Jesus is calling YOU too. Just like Peter and Andrew, He wants us to follow Him. Jesus also wants us to help others follow Him! That means we can be fishers of men — kids who spread love, truth, and the Good News of God. When we share about Jesus, when we are kind, or invite someone to church or Sunday School, we are helping others feel His light.

## **Family Homework**

- Follow the Leader Game: Play a fun game of "Follow the Leader" to remind us how we follow Jesus in real life.
- Fishing for Kindness: Cut out fish shapes and write on kind act on each. Each day pick one to "catch" and do it.

"Follow Me, and I will make you fishers of men." Matthew 4:19


# **CRAFT - FISHING FOR FRIENDS ROD**

If Jesus walked up to you today and said, "Follow Me", what would you say or do?


**MATERIALS:** 

Construction Paper Ribbon or String Paper Towel Tube Scissors Hole Punch Markers



#### **INSTRUCTIONS:**

- 1. Draw and cut fish shapes out of the paper.
- 2. Decorate the fish, writing down names of people that need prayer or who need to hear the good news of Jesus.
- 3. Decorate the paper towel tube; adding the verse "Fishers of Men" to decorate.
- 4. String the fish and attach them to the tube using punched holes or tape.
- 5. Pray for your "fish"!
